## Purpose

To help you understand what it means to follow Jesus and the importance of relationships.

## Discipleship

## Mark 1:14-18

Q: What is the invitation?

- The invitation is to follow Jesus and spend time learning from Him.
- Jesus is inviting them into a life of eternal impact.


## Luke 9:23-26

- Self-denial and carrying your cross means putting God's will above your own will even to the point of pain or death.

Q: What do you value more, your life now or your eternity with God?

## Luke 14:25-33

- Jesus was interested in true followers, not in gaining popularity. (v25)
- Discipleship involves prioritizing relationships and Jesus has to be number one. (v26)
- Following Jesus is a serious decision that needs to be evaluated. (v30)
- Jesus wants to be Lord of our lives, which requires total surrender. (v33)

Matthew 28:18-20
Q: What is Jesus calling us to do?

- Jesus calls us to make disciples, baptize them and teach them to obey His commands. (Be One, Make One)
