DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Conversation Starters

- Do you think that technology has made relationships easier, harder, or just different?

Sermon Discussion

- **Read:** Genesis 2:18;24, Proverbs 27:12, 2 Corinthians 6:14
1. In Genesis 2:18, God created Eve as a suitable helper so that Adam wouldn't only have companionship but also a partner in the mission God had given him. How does viewing dating as discovering mission compatibility—rather than just emotional attraction—change the way you think about relationships?
 2. Chemistry can spark attraction, but Scripture teaches that relationships need a deeper foundation built on shared faith and convictions. In 2 Corinthians 6:14, Paul reminds believers that spiritual alignment matters when building a life together. For singles, what might it look like to prioritize Christ over chemistry when dating? For married couples, how does keeping Christ central strengthen your relationship today?
 3. In Genesis 2:24, marriage is described as a binding covenant rather than a temporary agreement based on feelings. What do you think it looks like to build relationships that reflect lasting commitment rather than temporary emotion?
 4. Mike reminded us that our worth is not something we have to prove to earn someone's love or attention. Because God values us deeply, healthy relationships should reflect honor and appreciation for that God-given worth. For singles, how can understanding your value in God shape the standards you have in dating? For married couples, how can you affirm and honor the value of your spouse in everyday life?
 5. In Genesis 2:18, Adam had a purpose and relationship with God before he had a partner. Healthy relationships flourish when two people pursue God individually and then walk together in shared faith and purpose. What are some signs that a relationship might be becoming codependent rather than Christ-centered? How can singles and marrieds keep their relationship rooted in their personal walk with God?
