DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Conversation Starters

- If you had to wear the same outfit every single day for an entire year, what would it be?
- Which is harder for you: being patient with slow drivers, long lines, or people who text back three days later?

Sermon Discussion

- **Read:** Colossians 3:11-17
1. Paul reminds the Colossians that they are: chosen, holy, and dearly loved. When our identity is secure in Christ, we no longer need to compete, compare, or prove ourselves to one another. Which part of that identity—chosen, holy, or dearly loved—is hardest for you to fully believe? How would embracing our identity in Christ improve our relationships?
 2. Paul tells believers to put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience because healthy community requires more than simply being in the same room. These qualities do not come naturally, especially when we are surrounded by people who are different from us. Which of these qualities do you most need to “put on” in your relationships right now?
 3. Paul assumes that disagreements and grievances will happen in community, but he calls us to bear with one another, and forgive as the Lord forgave us. Mature community isn’t conflict-free; it is a community that refuses to let offense, gossip, or division have the final word. Is there a relationship where God may be calling you to forgive, or have an honest conversation rather than withdrawing or holding onto an offense?
 4. Paul concludes by saying, “Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly.” A mature community is not held together by similar personalities, backgrounds, or interests, but by Jesus being at the center of everything we do. What would it look like for the message of Christ to become central in the way your group gathers, talks, serves, and does life together?
